



Mandatory Food Safety Training For staff and volunteers

A new national Food Safety Standard has been added; Standard 3.2.2A: Food Safety Management Tools. Businesses must have the new requirements in place by <u>8 December 23</u>.

The Standard introduces new requirements for businesses that handle unpackaged, ready-to-eat (RTE), and potentially hazardous foods.

Businesses must implement the following new food safety management tools:

- mandatory food handler training
- implementation of a food safety supervisor

To do this your business must:

- make sure all food handlers have completed a food safety training course or can demonstrate their food handling skills and knowledge.
- appoint a certified food safety supervisor and ensure they are reasonably available when the business handles unpackaged, potentially hazardous, RTE foods.

Out and about with Hon. Zoe Bettison MP

A big day in Parliament with the introduction of **new rental reforms**. These reforms will look to support renters through:

- Allowing tenants to have pets in rental homes with reasonable conditions;
- Introducing prescribed grounds to terminate or not renew a tenancy;
- Extending the notice period to end a tenancy from 28 days to 60 days;
- Protecting tenants' information;
- Ensuring rental properties comply with minimum housing standards;
- Providing additional support for victims of domestic violence.

SCC Business Watch ... Shoplifting



Be aware of common shoplifting tactics Shoplifters are constantly coming up with new ways to steal without getting caught. Knowing the most common ploys/behaviors shoplifters employ will

help you be on guard in your own store:

- Working in pairs: One person distracts staff while the other pockets goods.
- Hiding products: Shoplifters often hide items in their own clothing, in other items they've actually purchased, handbags, strollers, reusable shopping bags, etc.
- Price switching: Shoplifting doesn't always mean missing items that aren't paid for. Thieves will also often swap pricing

- tags or labels from one product to another so they're charged less for a more expensive item.
- Grab and run: Some shoplifters wait for an opportune moment – e.g. a busy period, or when all sales staff appear to be busy to dash into your store and run off quickly with items. This is more common in stores that don't have anti-theft alarms placed at the entrance.
